

Faith Factor by Pastor Sally Hanson

Many years ago, there was a popular TV show called *Fear Factor*. The premise was to have contestants face a number of different fears that included a task to complete. Some of these challenges were about heights, speed, drops and jumping between moving vehicles. Others included things like eating disgusting foods and being placed in an aquarium of tarantulas for a set amount of time. The closing line of the show once a winner was announced was, "Clearly, fear was not a factor for you!"

I wonder what it would be like to approach faith in the same way, meaning when do we have a faith factor? When we make decisions? Go through our day? Or even in communicating with others? The faith factor is also a preventative factor to health; a way of reducing stress, deep connections with a caring community that bring social and crisis support, a prayer life or meditation that can also calm the nervous system. The faith factor is also a key component to those who have hit rock bottom and need a point of hope and something steady to cling to while their world is turned upside down like those directly and indirectly affected by addiction, mental illness, grief, loneliness and pain. Faith can not only be a preventative factor but it is also a factor of endurance and hope.

Where is the faith factor playing a role in our life? What does that faith factor look like in your life and how is it at work?

During this season of Lent, we come to a season that inspires reflection and interior work. Perhaps the faith factor is the key to unlocking some of those hidden places you have kept guarded and locked down so the world wouldn't see what lies within you, but also so you could ignore or forget those things in our life that may have caused you pain.

As you discover and discern what your faith factor looks like, I pray you find the hope and endurance that faith and trust in Jesus Christ brings to you and yours.

Hopefully, "Faith is a factor for you!"


#### **COOL Easter Bagskets**

enough to fit in the egg. Please look for our collection box in the narthex and return items by **March 11**.




Easter Breakfast

#### **Journey** faith, discipleship, generosity

Typically when we think of salvation, we think of being saved from our sins so that we might spend eternity with God in heaven. We believe that this kind of salvation cannot be earned, but instead is the result of God's grace and mercy through faith in Jesus Christ. Another way we say this is that there isn't anything we can do to get God to love us any more or any less. We might think of this as Salvation with a capital "S."

Perhaps there is another kind of salvation we need to consider that is more relevant to us here and now, salvation with a small "s." This kind of salvation has to do with the wellbeing and wholeness that breaks into our lives and world, making a difference today. Jesus made the distinction between just going through the motions in life, or choosing abundant or true life. Likewise, in the Apostle Paul's letter to Timothy, Paul writes about "taking hold of the life that truly is life." Both Jesus and Paul seem to suggest there are some ways to live that are better than others, and in this case, what we do matters.

Rabbi Rami Shapiro makes a similar point in his book *The Sacred Art of Lovingkindness: Preparing to Practice*. How we engage with life does make a difference as far as what we experience.

"The question at the heart of this book is this: Will you engage this moment with kindness or with cruelty, with love or with fear, with generosity or scarcity, with a joyous heart or an embittered one? This is your choice and no one can make it for you. If you choose kindness, love, generosity, and joy, then you will discover in that choice the Kingdom of God, heaven, nirvana, this - worldly salvation. If you choose cruelty, fear, scarcity, and bitterness, then you will discover in that choice the hellish states of which so many religions speak. These are not ontological realities tucked away somewhere in space - these are existential realities playing out in your own mind. Heaven and hell are both inside of you. It is your choice that determines just where you will reside."



#### The Birthday of Johann Sebastian Bach



You are invited to mark Wednesday, March 21, on your calendar to attend worship at 7:30 pm. Inviting friends to join you is also encouraged. The day in question is the birthday of Johann Sebastian Bach, and we are celebrating it with a performance of his most famous solo cantata, "Ich habe genug," the title coming from the first three words of the work's opening aria. Our guest soloist will be Rick Ziebarth, a fine baritone, who has sung with us several times. Rick's accompaniment, as called for by the score, will be two violins, viola, cello, oboe and harpsichord. Prior to the performance Carl Grapentine, the morning voice of WFMT, will once again be with us. This time, however, Carl will be speaking, not conducting. Most weekday mornings on 98.7 FM Carl offers what he calls his "daily dose of J.S. Bach." Thus, it is a treat and an honor for Carl to be with us so he can talk about his favorite composer on the great man's birthday.

"Ich habe genug" was first performed in Leipzig on February 2, 1727, four years after Bach arrived in that city. Thus it falls within that framework of the intense period of composition that took place during Bach's early years in the town he would eventually put on the musical map of the world. The cantata consists of three arias, separated by two recitatives. The text of the opening aria is actually a paraphrase of the Nunc dimittis, the Song of Simeon found in Luke 2:22-32. Simeon is saying that he can now "depart in peace," or die, now that he has seen the baby Jesus. The German paraphrase is something like "I have had enough." The second aria, "Schlummert ein," is a lullaby. And the third aria, "Ich freue mich auf meinen Tod," declares that the singer is looking forward to his own death, again in the spirit of the original Nunc dimittis.

The oboe part of "Ich habe genug" is one of the most famous passages in the repertoire of that instrument. Our guest oboist will be Andy Nogal, who has never played for us previously. Andy does, however, come to us recommended by Naomi Bensdorf Frisch who has played for us numerous times. By the way, Naomi is a newly credentialed lawyer, specializing in matters concerning labor. I can well see her being called upon the next time the contract of the members of the Chicago Symphony, for example, comes up for renewal.

This year marks the 333rd birthday of J. S. Bach. He was born in Eisenach, in the state of Thuringia, Germany in 1685, and baptized two days later at St. George's Lutheran Church. Yet today when babies are baptized in the church, that J. S. Bach was baptized at that same font is noted. One of the godfathers present was named Sebastian, hence the source of Bach's middle name. Bach was the youngest of eight children. His father, Ambrosius, was the chief town musician and was doubtless the source of his son's early, diverse musical training. Sadly, both of Bach's parents died during his 9th



year, thus beginning a series of moves that eventually would see him spending his final 27 years in Leipzig.

It is believed that Bach wrote five cycles of cantatas for the liturgical year, but only 300 or so of them are extant. They were usually presented before and after a sermon, with the cantata text complementing the Word. Once they were sung, scholars conclude that the pages of many cantatas were thrown in the trash, or used to wrap fish or whatever commodity needed a cover. There was no sense that the presentation of a Bach cantata was a matter of historical importance.

333 years later, however, we at Holy Cross are keenly aware of the significance of Johann Sebastian Bach and his music. To mention only two not-so-small facts: Bach was the chief musical proponent of the theology of Martin Luther, and his very life, 1685-1750, is the summit to which all Western music prior to those dates is leading, and the pinnacle from which all Western music flows thereafter.

#### Hunger 2 Hope Lake County MobilePack Meal Delivery Update #2

As you may recall, a total of 544,320 meals were packed by members of Holy Cross and other volunteers from Lake County during last December's MobilePack at Pet Factory in Mundelein.

In February, news came in that the second and final shipment of 272,160 lifesaving meals were on their way to Uganda through the Children's Hunger Fund (CHF). "CHF is a Christian non-profit organization that seeks to alleviate the suffering of children by equipping God's church to communicate the gospel through effective compassion ministry." #### **News from Boy Scout Troop #194**

2017 was another great year for Boy Scout Troop 194; some of highlights from 2017 include:

- Our Scouts earned more than 142 merit badges and achieved 33 rank advancements.



Faith & Health Night for Youth (grades 6 - 12) and Families


#### Sunday, March 4 at 6:30 pm

Stress, pressure and expectations continue to weigh on the hearts and minds of our youth. To relieve these pressures, youth can turn to healthy or unhealthy choices. According to the 2014 Youth Survey of Lake County, 13 % of 6th graders have used a substance (alcohol, tobacco, inhalants, marijuana) and 65% of 12th graders. This raises another 2-8% when you add illicit drugs (like cocaine, heroin) and prescription painkillers. These illicit drugs continue to have a deep impact on our communities as Lake County has seen an increase in deaths related to illicit drug use in the last few years.

So how is it that we can support our youth through some very stressful years? We can support them by giving them the information they need to make better choices, information to parents to help provide strategies for care and support and encouraging participation in preventative factors. Preventative factors include things like four or more caring adults that have positive influence over a youth, participation in activities like music or sports, and a faith community.

Faith is a key preventative factor. Faith, and a faith community, provide a safe and accepting place for youth. It helps in navigating the unknown by relating to those who also walk in faith and the mystery of God.

Come and join us for a "Faith & Health Night" for Holy Cross 6-12th graders, their parents and families. There will be a presentation by Joan Sheldon, Holy Cross member. Joan is a Health Educator with Robert Crown Center for Health Education in Hinsdale, and will be discussing risk factors, prevention, as well as her experience in the immediate surrounding high schools and in Lake County. This will be the Confirmation session for the night as well as the high school event. Please join us for this family conversation with youth and parents as we navigate together to role of faith and health in our lives.




