## Welcome Home...

I have often thought that if we could see the journey whole, we might never undertake it, might never dare the first step that propels us from the place we have known toward the place we know not. Call it one of the mercies of life's journey. That we see it only by stages as it opens before us, as it comes into our keeping, and step by single step. By our going we discover certain life lessons that serve us well: to be faithful to the next step; to rely on more than our preconceived plans; to heed the signposts of intuition and dreams; to follow the path that only we will recognize; to keep an open eye for the wonders that we encounter along the journey; and, to press on beyond distractions, beyond fatigue, beyond what would tempt us from taking the next step.

These are lessons that we hopefully learn. The choice becomes whether to keep them, break them or make them all over again when the journey is revealed by turns we could not have foreseen. Since March 2020, we have individually and collectively been on a journey not of our choosing. These past 17 months have asked us to adapt, modify our expectations and practice sacrifice. Even our understanding of where "home" fits into the equation and what it will look like in the future is not the same. The last time I went through a fundamental shift in my sense of "home" was when I was considering the possibility of attending college. Once I started college I never lived at my parent's home for any extended period of time. I visited and stayed over summer breaks but I would never live there full time again. My understanding about "home" went through a transformation. I discovered that addresses do not define your sense of "home". Home is where you can be yourself with no pretense. Home is where you are welcomed, encouraged and loved. Home is a connection to values and beliefs that you continue to live into as you discover your own way. Home is a place of origin to which you return to be renewed.

Recently through conversations with many of you, I realize that it is time to come home. It is also time to reimagine what "home" may look like. I believe it is fair to say that the world has changed but our mission at Holy Cross remains the same. We hope that Holy Cross feels like "home" in a spiritual, emotional and physical sense. It is a place located on St. Mary's Road but as we have learned it is more than just the wood, brick and mortar. It is "home" where we don't need to pine for the past but are encouraged to reach for a future that God invites us to participate in. A future where everyone counts or no one counts.

There is no denying that the future will not look the same as the past because of the journey we have been on. That is the way it is supposed to be. We have learned the difference between what is necessary and what is essential. We have learned that change brings about transformation in ways that we may never have considered. We have been nimble in our decision making and discovered that there are some sacrifices for others that are worth our effort.

Holy Cross is a "home" for pilgrims on a faith journey. Holy Cross is a community of believers for people of faith since 1980 (41 years). It is time to reimagine what "home" at Holy Cross will be as we move forward. There will be constants like our core values and teachings, our vision and what we aspire to become. We will differentiate between mission and method. We are reimagining Sunday mornings to provide worship, faith formation and fellowship. We are reimagining how we will connect with one another in-person and remotely throughout the week. We are reimagining new ways of equipping people of faith to practice lives of faith wherever that may need to be: at home, school, work, part of community life and at church. We are reimagining what it means for us to serve and care compassionately for those who are forgotten or marginalized. Please read further in this month's newsletter for more details and ways for you to become involved and engaged in the work of God's kingdom. So, Welcome Home!

# You're Invited To Worship With Us

All three worship options feature the same sermon message each week.

Please note the following changes to Covid-19 protocols that reflect CDC, IDPH and LCPH guidance, effective July 1.

As we begin to host more in-person events at church during the week, we will follow guidelines and check in with each group as to their comfort level regarding masks. If participants are fully vaccinated, then masks will be optional. We recognize that vaccines are not currently available for our youngest members and guests and encourage you to consider their safety as well in making your mask choices.

The 8 am in-person sanctuary worship opportunity no longer requires you to RSVP. We will continue to offer social distance seating. Anyone who is fully vaccinated is no longer required to wear a mask but may do so. If you are not vaccinated, we require you to wear a mask. We will still ask attendees to sign-in. We are utilizing liturgy and hymnody as part of this service.

The 10 am drive-in worship service is outdoors and masks will no longer be required. Again, if a mask is your choice we respect that decision. You may remain in your vehicle or bring a lawn chair and enjoy the outdoors. We are utilizing liturgy and hymnody as part of this service. When Holy Communion is offered we will continue with the individual communion kits. Holy Communion is being offered on the first and third Sundays of each month. Offerings may be made in person, through traditional mail delivery, or on-line at the church's website.

## Reimagining "Sunday Morning at Holy Cross"

We are all anxious to return to experiences and expressions of life that we have missed since March 2020. We have been willing to try different approaches while still honoring certain traditions and practices. As we hopefully move beyond Covid-19, we are discussing what life after the pandemic might look like. We are "reimagining" worship options and new approaches to faith formation/education other than the traditional Sunday School format. On this page are the beginnings of us reimagining what the future holds for us. We hope you will plan on joining us as we reimagine Sunday mornings at Holy Cross. As we have done for the past 17 months, we will follow CDC IDPH guidelines regarding safety protocols in all worship formats and gatherings. Beginning Sunday, September 12 our Sunday morning schedule will look like this:



- 8 & 10 am In-Person Worship in the Sanctuary
- Fellowship and Faith Formation (Sunday School) will be offered between worship services at 8:45 9:45 am. The starting date for the Faith Formation component is yet to be determined.

## Reimagining "Worship"

Worship is one of the foundational moments in the Christian faith. It is the opportunity for people of faith to pause, reflect, wonder, celebrate and be renewed to practice a life of faith in our everyday lives. It is the Biblical equivalent to "sabbath" time. At Holy Cross we utilize different liturgical resources to promote interest and variety in the act of worship. Confession, music, prayer, scripture and the sacraments provide the liturgical movements. Sabbath has never been limited to a certain time, day, style or format. We enjoy a worship approach that encourages participation and an opportunity for individuals and families to bring and offer their spiritual needs where they feel supported and encouraged. In addition to the in-person worship on Sunday mornings beginning in September we will continue to provide the following worship opportunities:

- Virtual Worship pre-recorded video each week available on demand at HolyCrossChurch.org/sermons

Beginning in October, we will be offering a worship service on the first Saturday of each month:

- First Saturday In-person Worship at 5 pm. This service may be held in the sanctuary, patio or even in the parking lot as a drive-in worship service.

## Reimagining "Faith Formation"

Faith formation occurs on many different levels. It may be a personal journey, a family centered conversation or a multigenerational experience. Holy Cross believes it involves all three. In the fall our goal is to "celebrate the expansive image of God in everyone, through open and inclusive language, diverse imagery, and thoughtful theology." The launch of this reimagined faith formation will begin later in September on Sunday mornings between worship services. It is our goal to provide a Sunday morning resource event that will enable individuals and families to feel confident and comfortable talking about faith and spirituality with their kids and with other adults. These Sunday morning resource events will be scripturally based, involve conversations for reflection/discussion, provide a spiritual micro-practice, prayer, music and fellowship. There will be shareable social media material available to continue exploring faith with others at home.

# Reimagining "How We Stay Connected"

Relational groups exist at Holy Cross around study themes, Bible studies, book clubs, activities involving service to others, and for a myriad of different reasons. Holy Cross is making the commitment to provide in-person opportunities, remote opportunities and hybrid opportunities. We have learned as a result of the past 17 months that technology provides a totally different kind of access and involvement for different needs. In-person participation is still preferrable. However, there may be times when personal and work schedules may preclude your involvement in a meeting, a relational group, a special event or even worship. Holy Cross has made an investment in equipment and social media resources to make additional resources available to individuals and families in different contexts. These digital opportunities will involve our congregational Zoom subscription and our new "live streaming" capabilities. Each event will dictate what technological options may be utilized and may not be available for every event.

## Reimagining "Fellowship"

We will resume our coffee hours on Sunday mornings after each of the worship services starting in September. We hope you will plan on joining us as we reimagine fellowship at Holy Cross. We also have plans to provide special "catered breakfasts" on the following Sundays: September 26, October 24, November 28 at 9 am.

## Piles of Dirt and Other Cool News

If you have been wondering about the machinery, excavating, and piles of dirt next to the sanctuary along St. Mary's Road, here is the story. A few months ago, our neighbor to the north in Terre Fair noticed part of their backyard was like a swamp. After getting Lake County Public Works involved, the prevailing theory was that



Holy Cross had an underground leak in our freshwater supply line. After some detective work, digging around, and a few false starts, we thought the problem had been identified in early July, but work is still ongoing at this time to resolve the leak.

In other building-related news, Holy Cross has ordered two new HVAC units to replace heating and cooling systems used in the sanctuary and the "West Wing." We are expecting to receive the equipment and have it installed in the last half of August. As our buildings age, it is a natural consequence that portions of our mechanicals will need replacement. Financially we can cover the expenses through money set aside for capital replacement and building repairs. Thank you for your understanding if you should find yourself warmer than desired during worship until the new equipment is installed.

Decision: I will take the past, present and future in consideration.




# Introducing... Classroom Names!

## Back to School

You'll soon be finding out what teacher your child has and maybe they (or you) will be comparing notes with friends to find out who else is in their class.

As you prepare for the new school year, perhaps you can also prepare to go deeper in faith with your student in one (or more) of these ways:

- One of the ways Holy Cross will be supporting you and your student will be by providing a backpack tag and a blessing on Sunday, August 22. We believe that God goes with us wherever we go and a backpack tag can help our kids remember that God is with them and loves them in any of the situations they find themselves in this year. When you receive your tag, help your student put it on their bag and remind them that God is with them as they head off to school each day.
- Perhaps you might start a new ritual like introduced through Faith 5, (which you may recognize as a focus from Holy Cross in previous years). The steps for Faith 5 are:

STEP 1: **SHARE** your highs and lows

STEP 2: **READ** a Bible verse or story

STEP 3: TALK about how the Bible reading might relate to your highs and lows

STEP 4: PRAY for one another's highs and lows

STEP 5: **BLESS** one another

As you talk with your student about their new year, perhaps you can help them pray for the various people who will surround them this year. Talk about those they know: other students, the teachers they've had before (like those who teach specials classes), their principal and other administrators, after school caregivers. Talk about those they don't yet know: their main classroom teacher, new students, or students they just haven't met yet. Pray for each of these people, and pray for your student and the situations they will be in this year.

Finally, you can remind your students that you are praying for them. This not only helps them know that you're supporting them, but it also models how you practice your faith—giving them a path they can follow.

Young people in third grade or above will receive a Bible on Sunday, October 24 during worship. This Bible is a student study Bible. On Saturday, October 23 we walk through the Old & New Testaments to begin to frame all the wonderful pieces that are part of the written resource.



The confirmation ministry at Holy Cross will resume in-person on Sunday, October 3, 6:30 - 8 pm. Confirmation is offered to 6 - 8 grade youth. Confirmation sessions will be comprised of a large group learning moment, worship and music experience and small relational groups for sharing and conversation. # What We Sing

"Randy" is a diminutive form of my middle name, which is "Randall." When a telemarketer or some other stranger calls and uses my first name, I hang up instantly because I know they don't know me.

We have a book in our church that we call out of habit a hymnal. In truth, however, this "hymnal" is actually an anthology of different kinds of vocal music. We sing these different kinds of music as a community, even though some of these pieces are not hymns at all. Interestingly enough the official name of our hymns is Evangelical Lutheran Worship or ELW. This title lacks the word "hymnal." Without being too pedantic, I shall attempt to wade through the somewhat tricky terrain of musical nomenclature.

At the start, however, I shall name some familiar pieces that are truly hymns: "Holy, Holy, Holy," "Lift High the Cross," "Lead On, O King Eternal," "For All the Saints," "All Glory, Laud, and Honor," and "Oh, for a Thousand Tongues to Sing." In the 1960s this last hymn, whose text was written by Charles Wesley, appeared on page 1 of the Methodist hymnal and proudly covered a full page in 3/2 time. In the ELW this same hymn is at the back, is presented in 3/4 time, and occupies only half a page. Wesley would probably have preferred that the editors of the ELW have not included this virtual Methodist theme song at all if they were going to treat it so shabbily.

The many German chorales we sing are hymns, but they were German chorales first and remain so. "O Sacred Head" (#351) is perhaps the consummate example of this genre.

"Precious Lord, Take My Hand" (#773) is a very popular representative of black gospel music. "Amazing Grace" (#779) is a white spiritual which appeared in a songbook entitled Southern Harmony in 1835. By the way, "Amazing Grace" is also pentatonic, meaning that it consists of only five notes and can be played entirely on the black notes of the piano.

Another type of music we sing in church is a carol as at Christmas. These are so popular that I need not offer examples. A carol has a sacred text. We also sing many pieces of music at Christmas that are not carols, but are songs, "White Christmas," for example. One can also think of other Christmas songs, most of which are secular, and know that they are certainly not in our hymnal.

And speaking of songs, the ever popular "On Eagle's Wings" (#787) is a song, not a hymn. Accordingly, it is more suited to a soloist than a congregation and can be played on guitar.

The presentation in our hymnal of the ubiquitous children's song "Jesus Loves Me" (#595) is quite strange. If one did not know the tune and saw it in our hymnal, one would likely sing it much too fast. This is because this song is presented in 2/4 time with a grouping of eighth notes, when it should be presented in 3/4 time with quarter notes. I play it from memory and would not dream of looking at the music in our hymnal for fear of being confused by what is there.

The Taize pieces in our hymnal are more chant than hymn.

There are probably other genres of music to be identified in our hymnal that I have overlooked. I should mention that the front of our hymnal is occupied with service music, i.e., setting of the Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei, that we sing because we are a liturgical church. Far and away the finest piece of service music

we sing is "Thanks Be To You," the post-communion canticle in the Haugen setting of the liturgy, found in what is called the Hymnal Supplement.

Although predominantly containing hymns, the ELW is actually a cornucopia of varying musical styles. It might be satisfying or even fun to know when you are singing therein something other than a hymn. When someone does not call me "Randy," I know they don't know me. The good news is that you can sing something and perhaps enjoy it, even if you don't know what genre of music it is at all.

## Randy Casey News and Thank You...

Randy Casey has been Holy Cross' Director of Music for almost 30 years. The Church Council regrettably accepted Randy's letter of resignation on Thursday, July 15. A separate letter was mailed to the membership of Holy Cross informing them of Randy's decision. Sunday, August 8 will be Randy's last Sunday with us. On Sunday, August 1 members of the choir will perform one last piece under his direction during the 10 am drive-in worship service. On Sunday, August 8 there will be receptions following both the 8 am in-person worship service and the 10 am drive-in worship service that will afford people the opportunity to offer their appreciation for his time with us.

There is a special gift being planned that will provide you with the opportunity to leave your name on a piece of artwork on Sundays, August 1 & 8. If you are unable to attend either of those Sundays, you may stop by the church office that week and participate in that way.


