Restore and Refresh...

It is safe to say that Jesus saw value in each day. He was open to the building of relationships and the effort that goes into developing trust. He had a spirit of gratitude for the simple moments that reminded him of the beauty of God created days. He embraced an appreciation for the joy that comes from being curious, imaginative and willing to entertain the mystery of those moments in life that may go beyond our ability to understand.

In other words, Jesus showed up. Jesus showed up for:

- the Samaritan woman at the well
- the healing of the ten lepers
- blind Bartimaeus
- the man who was lame and whose friends lowered him through the roof
- the 5,000 who were nurtured with the sermon on the mount
- the conversation with the rich young ruler, Nicodemus
- the woman who was to be stoned to death, and so many others.

What about us? What does it look like for us to "show up" each day as people of faith? What does it mean for us to be connected to one another?

It is a simple enough concept. It may not seem to be that profound on the surface of life. Here's the good news: no matter how discouraged or distracted we may get, Jesus walks with us. For the disciples, the Emmaus road experience revealed, our faith journey is enriched when we are connected to Jesus in the present moments of life. The Gospel narrative radiates with the good news of the power and the presence of Jesus. Jesus leads. Jesus provides. Jesus anoints. Jesus' goodness and mercy are with us always.

When we are connected to each other, we realize that even though the specifics are unique to each of us, there are topics, moments, situations, and needs where God's Word may offer us some insight into our lives. When we are connected to each other, we have our faith stretched and deepened. Our connection with God and one another is not about making us feel shamed, chastised, isolated but a sense of belonging and being loved. When we have the opportunity to be connected to each other, we discover that every idea, old or new, is needed; every person, young or aged, is valued; every soul, troubled or overly-satisfied or whole, is treasured; every spirit, tired or high strung, is refreshed; and, every child of God is welcomed into a family of faith where God's other children wait with open arms.

In Christ, the sacred/holy shows up in the ordinary/every day. Jesus calls us out where we are buried in our fears, our pain, our grief, our worries, and life's pressures. Thank God Jesus shows up to restore and refresh us each day.

Ordinary Time? by Pastor Chris Neptun

I am excited to be writing this to you as your pastor! The time seems anything but ordinary. It's a time of change, transition, and excitement for Holy Cross. Like me, you may wonder what the next chapter of life will bring. Easter was just weeks ago. Pentecost is coming with the Spirit's power and mystery.

Things are extraordinary for difficult reasons too. There is war in Ukraine, an uncertain economy, memories of and concerns around the pandemic, continued issues of hunger and poverty, inequality, health concerns, family troubles... you get the idea. We experience joyful and troubled times, sometimes at the same time. Other times it feels as if nothing is happening at all. It's just, well... ordinary. We live with paradox, trouble with joy, uncertainty with hope.

I am a bit of a word geek. I get into etymology, the root of words, their origin, meaning and alternate meanings. "Ordinary" can mean "of no special quality or interest; commonplace; unexceptional." In church, ordinary refers to green times, time after Epiphany or Pentecost typically in January and February, and June to November (not Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter). For church, refers to "an order or form for divine service." On the day of Pentecost, God shows once again how they use the "ordinary" extraordinarily. Ordinary people speak about God's amazing deeds of power in languages they do not know so others hear extraordinarily in a language they do know.

Even in seemingly ordinary times, God is with us doing extraordinary things through us. With the Holy Spirit in and around us, we speak and live out God's amazing deeds of power. I look forward to us watching for, taking part in, and experiencing God's divine service together in the extraordinary AND the ordinary times!

Summer at Holy Cross

Holy Cross will provide a variety of worship, fellowship and educational (faith formation) opportunities during the Summer of 2022. In lieu of a traditional one-week Vacation Bible School experience, we will provide educational experiences between the Sunday morning worship services. These are intended for any age. We will use a curriculum called "Messy Church" which includes Bible stories, activities, crafts and a lot of fun. Held outdoors on the front lawn, it will begin on Sunday, June 12 from 9 to 9:45 am and will run through Sunday, July 31. More details on page 7. We will resume faith formation on "Rally Day" Sunday, September 11.

We enjoy each other's company at Holy Cross. We are planning a number of fellowship events where we can come together for conversation and food. The church will make the arrangements to provide the food unless otherwise specified. On Sundays we will encourage the use of the patio for fellowship space as needed.

Worship plays a vital role in our community life together. During the Summer months of June, July and August we will offer worship every Saturday evening at 5:30 pm. 
Staff Training

Faith Formation

A song from my college years came on the radio (Run Around by Blues Traveler) last week when my 5-year old and I were driving home. My thoughts were focused on college memories when that voice from the backseat piped up telling me that he liked this song! Lost in my nostalgia I jabbered about how old I was when I first heard that song—but was kindly asked to be quiet so he could listen to it!

Songs from a particular time in life can be weighed down with more than their catchy tune or fun lyrics. They can carry baggage. The baggage of this song is positive for me, but still it's weighted with memory that my son just does not have. Obviously, he will have experiences and in a few decades may associate certain times of life with songs that have yet to be written. And while I'd love if his music appreciation would include that which I have found meaningful and fun, he will forge his own connection to song.

I wonder if there is something to be learned about how we pass on faith as we think about how we share our experience of music with the kids in our lives. Sometimes we bring a lot of baggage into the ways we tell stories—the ways we appreciate worship and music—and our expectations of what it means to follow Christ. We are invested in our own encounter with Jesus and our own practice of faith at the same time as we're hoping to give kids a foundation upon which to build.

Perhaps part of what we can do is give our kids opportunities to observe how we engage with Scripture, worship, music and faith. We can not only have the answers (or at least some of the answers), but be curious about a Bible passage or fed by a worship service together with the kids in our life.

Our kids' faith lives will not be the same as ours. And yet—God is present to them, working in and through them. Seeking to connect to them in an experience that is their own. As I was trying to connect with my son about the song from my past, he was trying to enjoy it at his own level in the now. He would not have heard that song without me—and we did get to talk about how we liked the fast paced lyrics and fun melody, but his experience is his own.

Just like his experience with the story of the women discovering that Jesus' tomb was empty will be his own. Just like his connection with the liturgy will be (and already is beginning to be) his own. I can help by giving him the opportunity to experience these aspects of faith, and by living my own life of faith that he can see—but it will still be his own connection. Thanks be to God!

Lutheran Summer Camps) in their youth? That's one reason we're encouraging our families to sign up their kids for "water weekend" at Lutherdale this summer!



And God said, "Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. God called the dry land Earth and the waters that were gathered together God called Seas. And God saw that it was good (Gen 1:9-10, NRSV)

June 8, 2022 has been designated as World Ocean Day by The Ocean Project (theoceanproject.org). We might not live near the ocean, but we



can still celebrate World Ocean Day and remember that water is life. To better understand let's start locally and think in terms of watershed. To help explain, we can turn to the ELCA fact sheet, Caring For God's Creation: Stewarding the gift of water (elca.org/Resources/Advocacy#Issues)

A watershed is the land area and water bodies that capture and drain snow melt and rainwater into a common river or lake system and is the source for groundwater and drinking water. Holy Cross is in the Bull-Creek-Des Plaines River watershed located within the Upper Mississippi River watershed which drains into the Gulf of Mexico. Learn more about watersheds at mywaterway.epa.gov/community/libertyville,%20il/overview

Healthy watersheds mean healthy aquatic systems and drinking water. What happens here by way of stormwater run-off, pollution and land use impacts our local water quality, our watershed, and larger bodies of water downstream. Take some time this month to look at the web sites referenced here to learn more about the health of our watershed and oceans. Think about sources of pollutants and how they might be entering and impacting our watershed. Have a look at a map, think about a drop of water and trace how it might make its way down to the Gulf of Mexico and beyond. What does that drop carry with it?

By celebrating World Ocean Day, we are reminded to restore and care for our own watershed.
