Nurturing Our Mental Health

I've collaborated with various leaders and ministry partners of Holy Cross to brainstorm sermon series ideas for the last two years. It's been an incredibly energizing and enjoyable process! I've been surprised by the Holy Spirit guiding us to uncover God's messages through these sessions.

During one of these brainstorming sessions, a theme emerged that strikes a chord with many of us: Mental Health. The pandemic has brought to light the vulnerable need for mental well-being, with anxiety, stress, and depression affecting many of us. It's become clear that at some point in our lives, we will either know someone who is struggling with mental health issues or experience them ourselves. Mental health is an integral part of our human experience.

As Christians, we confess the divine and human nature of Jesus Christ. Because Jesus is fully human, he experiences various emotions, including anger, surprise, disgust, enjoyment, fear, and sadness, each with many feelings. Like us, we know he faced mental stress and the challenges human beings experience. It is comforting to know we are not alone, even in our struggles.

During Lent, we will explore the topic of mental health as we hear and understand "The Seven Last Words of Christ." We'll look at eight passages as part of a sermon series, one passage

each week, beginning with the sermon on Ash Wednesday and continuing each Sunday through Easter. Together, we'll explore these words Jesus spoke as he faithfully struggled with betrayal, pain, suffering, and death on the cross.

In addition to the sermon series, we will offer other supporting resources. There will be a weekly devotional to take you further into the last words of Christ. It includes a coloring sheet for each week to use as a contemplative practice. There will also be large coloring posters for each theme. If you or your family want to join in a larger project and color one of them, we will display them at church as we make our way through Lent.

Speakers from several organizations that provide resources and support for mental health have been invited to speak as we gather for Holden Evening Prayer during our midweek Lenten worship services on Wednesday nights starting on February 21 at 7 pm.

Sunday School students will watch and discuss the Disney Pixar Movie "Inside Out" to talk about the themes of emotions. Turn to the Sunday School column on page 8 to learn more.

Mental health can be a complex topic to discuss, requiring courage and vulnerability. I understand that. I also understand the stigma around mental health and the reluctance to share when struggling with it. In learning more and discussing the struggles we face with anxiety, stress, fear, and other realities in our lives, I hope we can create a safe space to discover resources helpful in reducing the stigma around caring for our mental well-being.

As you enter the season and wilderness of Lent, encountering things you may not understand or be fearful of, hear the words Moses spoke to the people of Israel before they entered the promised land, not knowing what they would encounter. "It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not fail you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed." (Deuteronomy 31:8 NRSV) Jesus also says to us at the end of the Gospel of Matthew, "...and remember I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20 - NRSV)

This Lenten season, our worship will be centered around the seven last words of Christ. We'll focus on these sayings of Jesus from the cross with a sermon series highlighting themes of mental health—one of our most requested sermon series themes.

At Holy Cross, we pride ourselves in meaningful children's ministry because we know our children are full humans who need to know they are loved by God. So when preparing for this Lenten season the big question was how do we include our kids in a way that is developmentally appropriate and accessible.

After a lot of brainstorming, with almost a dozen different people, here's what we came up with...

This Lent our kids in Sunday School will be looking at our emotions and how God loves us in and through all of our feelings. These lessons will use the framework of the familiar Pixar movie "Inside Out" as we follow the lectionary. We'll tie these scripture stories to different emotions each week, and the recurring theme is assuring kids of God's love no matter what they are feeling. *(Head over to Youth Ministry on page 8 to see more!)* But we're offering more for our families than a Lenten theme for Sunday School, we want to highlight our kids and center them in our worship space!

This year, families are invited to participate in helping us decorate our Sanctuary this Lent. Illustrated Ministry has created some lovely and easily accessible posters that reflect the seven last words of Christ on the cross. There's a poster for each week in our sermon series, which means we have seven posters waiting to be colored and we'll display a new one each week of Lent.

We're looking for people (young and old) to take a poster home for a week to color it, then bring it back to church to be displayed for our community.

Helping Hands and Servant Hearts

Beginning at the start of the Advent season, which is the start of the new liturgical year, Holy Cross has moved to distributing Holy Communion at every service. The ELCA adopted a statement in 1997 called "The Use and the Means of Grace". This document notes, "According to the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, Lutheran congregations celebrate the Holy Communion every Sunday and festival. This confession remains the norm for our practice."

We are therefore inviting additional worship volunteers to serve on the Altar Care Team with simple training being handled by an experienced team member or Pastor Chris or Deaconess Katie.

We are also welcoming volunteers to connect to serving in worship as Communion Assistants. Children of Confirmation age (grades 6-8) and adults are needed to distribute Holy Communion. The tasks are simple and involve holding the plate of wafers and greeting each communicant with the words "The body of Christ given for you." Or the tray of individual cups and greeting each communicant with the words "The blood of Christ shed for you." Or, holding the basket to collect the empty communion cups.

As a worship volunteer, you may schedule yourself or a family member for service times that fit your schedule.


