I hope you will join in the "faith formation" opportunities that we are offering so that we don't just "go" through life, rather, I pray that together we "grow" through life.



# Gaining Some Perspective by Deaconess Katie Freund

Recently a colleague shared a series of blog posts with me from the Family Service Center titled "Parenting is Hard"... and yeah, sometimes it really can be!

We've worked hard to focus on social emotional health in our family... my spouse and I can be pretty crunchy sometimes. But no matter how hard I try to be a great mom, I keep finding myself falling short of the high expectations I set for myself. I never seem to "arrive" at the finish line, and my relationship with my kids is never "perfected."

Lately I've been teaching my three-year-old that sometimes momma needs to practice being patient too. Then yesterday when someone cut me off on our morning commute, I had to brake suddenly and the diaper bag for our baby went flying. This meant that the inside pocket was soaking wet with an ounce and a half of breast milk from a tipped over bottle by the time we arrived at daycare. I was grumpy.

Pulling into the parking lot, I could see my three-year-old awkwardly looking around, avoiding eye contact 'cause she knew... momma was grumpy. So I took a deep breath, opened her car door to unbuckle her car seat and told her, "You know, I think I'm mad right now."

The very first thing she needed to hear was that I wasn't mad at her, and she did nothing wrong. Taking another deep breath, and feeling a little bit less grumpy already, I told her the truth, "I'm mad because the baby's milk spilled, and now he doesn't have as much milk to eat today, and there's a big mess to clean up." She shrugged that off without a second thought "Oh, well that's okay. We can get him more and we can clean messes up. It's okay Momma."

What is it that gets us wrapped up in our own minds? How do we lose perspective so easily? Instead of trying so hard to power through and get everything right, what does it take for us to admit what we're feeling and accept the present moment for what it is? These are lessons we need to be taught and retaught throughout our life. This applies to our careers and our personal lives, to how we approach communities and God, to how we view ourselves.

So, this week, I invite you to reflect on what gives you perspective in your own life.

# Installation of Reverend Christopher Neptun

Installation service for Reverend Christopher Neptun as Senior Pastor of Holy Cross Lutheran Church on Sunday, October 9 at 10 am with Bishop Yehiel Curry of the Metropolitan Chicago Synod of the ELCA presiding.

Background: Yes, Pastor Chris has been in his new role at Holy Cross since June 1. However, due to Bishop Curry's schedule, October 9 was the first Sunday that the installation service could be conducted. The installation will take place during the 10 am worship service with Bishop Curry presiding and presenting the message. Following the service, lunch will be served in the fellowship area and on the church patio (weather permitting). Please plan to join us on that special day as we celebrate with Pastor Chris and his family.



Reverend Christopher Neptun officially began his new pastoral role at Holy Cross on June 1, 2022. According to the transition plan, Pastor Chris and Pastor Bob are co-pastoring initially. This permits Pastor Chris the time for one-on-one interactions with various members of the congregation, to ascertain what they value about Holy Cross and what they desire for the future, and to gain a sense of what is essential for Holy Cross going forward. Pastor Bob continues in a full-time role for the first nine months. Pastor Chris and Pastor Bob are sharing pastoral care and leadership responsibilities during this time.

A "transition team" has been identified to work with Pastor Chris, Pastor Bob, church staff and the congregation through the first year. It is comprised of members from the call committee, staff support team, church council and general membership. They are:

At the end of this transition period (currently set for March 1, 2023), Pastor Bob will be away for three months of sabbatical leave. During the sabbatical, there will be ongoing conversations about the nature of a part-time presence for Pastor Bob. After the sabbatical period (approximately June 1), Pastor Bob will return in an agreed upon part-time role. This may take the form of annual contracts between Holy Cross and Pastor Bob where the role is adjusted each year as appropriate.

Holy Cross enjoys the fine arts of music, drama, media and visuals. We recognize the ways they enhance our communal gatherings. The Around The Cross Concert Series has been suspended since March 2020 due to the pandemic. We have missed the opportunities to come together and celebrate the gifts of a variety of artists. Holy Cross will be offering a new concert season beginning in October. We are finalizing the schedule of five or six performances. The season will be a celebration of various genres of music and style.

We will launch the concert series with Sophie Webber on Saturday, October 22 at 7 pm with a reception to follow. Sophie is an internationally acclaimed cello soloist, chamber musician, and educator of whom a glowing review and picture appeared in the June, 2018 issue of Gramophone magazine. Although born and educated in England, where she studied at the Trinity College of Music in London, she obtained advanced degrees in cello performance from Indiana University.

In addition to Sophie, we will enjoy Sue and Mike Blair in a coffeehouse setting on November 18. Dale Tippett Jr. and musicians from Holy Cross will offer a Christmas music party on December 10. The Chicagoland Voices community choir will present a concert on February 4, 2023. We are finalizing dates with Paul Vander Weele for an organ recital date in January 2023 and we have extended an invitation to the Red Rose Children's Choir for March 2023.

# Using Money to Take a Stand

Excerpt from *The Soul of Money: Transforming Your* Relationship with Money and Life by Lynn Twist.

"Whether you are aware of it or not, you make an impact each day with your choices about how you live and how you allocate your resources. If 'money talks' it is with our voice. Each financial choice you make is a powerful statement of who you are and what you care about. When you take a stand and have your money reflect that, it strengthens your sense of self.

You don't have to change careers, revolutionize your business, or pack up your family and move away from anything or to do anything to take a stand. You express your stand in the way you earn money, choosing work consistent with your values. You express your stand in the way you use money to provide food, clothing, shelter, or education for your family. It can be in the money you use to support others in your community or beyond, through food depositories, or shelters for battered women, troubled children, or homeless people. It can be in the money you use to empower your own creativity and self-expression, or otherwise nurture yourself through classes, books, or music. It can be in the money you pay for the products you buy, supporting the companies that produce them. It may be money you contribute to local, national, and global causes that inspire you, and the opportunity you offer others to do the same. If you are an employer, it can be the money you invest in the resources to make your workplace an expression of integrity, where employees and management have what they need to express their excellence.

We each have the power to arrange life so that the stand we take with our money and our life with money is a right-now, everyday, every-week expression of our core values, not a someday, next-year, or when-I-retire or when-I-have-enough expression of our core values. Every moment of every day there are chances to participate in expressing your individuality and creativity, in contributing to your vision for yourself, your family, your community, city, or world. When we bring this consciousness to our choices about money and use our resources—money, time, or talents—to take a stand for what we believe in, we come alive. We are flooded with a sense of purpose even in the smallest action, and a feeling of power and energy opens up in our life."

The September 12 deadline to register is fast approaching! We have a wonderful group of women already signed up and we want you to join us too!





This is a conversational model led by Pastor Chris and Pastor Bob for any post confirmation people of faith. We know there is creativity in uncovering the power of images for the formation of faith. We will be using content that provides access and insights for people who want to follow Jesus today. As practitioners of the Christian faith, we believe this is an opportunity to disciple one another towards a vibrant faith.

#### Choices...

Did you know that looking at pictures, images, and photographs connects with the emotional center of your brain? That is where we actually "see." So, processing pictures helps people make immediate internal and emotional connections to their own experiences. We don't bring the same life experiences to formation and discipleship. We will provide material that will allow each person the opportunity to explore a variety of overarching themes, targeted topics, visual image choices, and thoughtful questions.

#### **Topics and Texts...**

Visual Faith Process uses Scripture as the basis for topicexplorations that generate natural, vigorous conversations about what it means to follow Jesus today.



Only Eva holds the answer—but will she have the strength to revisit old memories and help reunite those lost during the war?

#### The Great Lakes

"Who has measured the waters in the hollow of their (his) hand?" - Isaiah 40:12 (NRSV)

My hope in writing this article every month is to get us thinking about our local environment with the idea that, as the poet Mary Oliver writes, "attention is the beginning of devotion," and then we save what we love. Oliver was warning us against looking without noticing. It is also important for us to "notice" our regional environment. To remember that we humans and the natural environment are interdependent, and that we notice what is happening upstream and how what we do impacts environments and creatures (human and non-human) downstream.

The Great Lakes region is one of the largest and important freshwater ecosystems in the world and is suffering poorer water quality, habitat degradation, and biodiversity loss. The Great Lakes region is one of the world's largest surface water systems, spanning 750 miles from west to east. The Lakes hold about 84% of North America's surface freshwater and about 21% of the world's supply of freshwater by volume. The Great Lakes are a precious water source providing drinking water for over 35 million people living in the region. According to the Rochester Institute of Technology, there is 22 million pounds of plastic that enter the Great Lakes waters every year. There are other pollutants that enter the Lakes from industrial operations, raw sewage discharge from sewer overflows, and stormwater runoff from the region.<sup>1</sup> All of which impacts the health of the Lakes' ecosystems. For more on work to restore and protect the Great Lakes see greatlakes.org

There are over 500 references to water in Scripture.<sup>2</sup> Water is life. The next time you take a drink of water, take a moment to be thankful for clean drinking water. Think about the source of that water, its abundance, and all the non-human creatures that depend on it as well. Are we doing our best to protect this precious gift of water?


