What Children Can Teach Us ...

From the moment that a child comes into our lives, we know that it's our responsibility to guide and teach them. The idea that "it takes a village" to nurture a child means that family, friends and other adults who they encounter all play a different role in their teachable moments. As newly formed little humans, they have a lot to discover and learn. And as adults, we are their tour guides who help them figure out this world. We show them sights they haven't seen; we take them to places they've never been. We teach them right from wrong, how to dress themselves, and why touching something hot is a bad idea. On a daily basis, we impart knowledge, provide wisdom, offer information, and love them. And just like little sponges, they soak it up and in. They learn to walk



and to talk, and to not lick the bottom of their shoes. But, as their teachers, we are so busy rearing, educating, and helping them to navigate the world that we often don't realize that *they* are teaching *us*.

So, what do they teach us? They teach us:

- To Ask Questions And Be Curious: It's important as an adult to remember that being inquisitive is how we learn. And there is always more to learn.
- To Experience Joy: Children appreciate the simple pleasures because they don't have unrealistic expectations. They understand that joy can be found anywhere. As adults, we must remember to keep seeking the simple pleasures.
- To Be Open: They don't see faults or flaws; they see the potential for a new friend and an opportunity to connect with another human being.
- To Live In The Moment: Children never stop playing because they must meet some self-imposed deadline. Instead, little ones stay in the moment and it makes life more enjoyable and they learn how to regulate emotions which has the potential of transforming each moment. It is like seeing the world new each day and not being stuck with only one way of understanding.
- To Be Passionate: When a child discovers a new activity, they embrace it with love and excitement.
 They put their whole selves into the endeavor. As adults, we need to remember to not temper our passion but rather embrace it—it's how greatness is achieved.
- To Not Limit Ourselves: Children believe they can be anything because they don't limit themselves.
 It's not their perceived flaws and shortcomings that dictate their dreams but rather their interests and passions. So, the next time you think you can't, remember that you can.
- To Be Fearless: Children jump, climb, and tumble. They taste, try, and run headlong into new experiences. It's a good reminder to adults that being bold and daring makes for the best memories and a much more interesting life.

Jesus offered this perspective in Mark 10:15: "Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." Jesus was blessed with insight into what God had hoped for in creating each of us. So, the next time we are rushing to finish a chore, or trudging from one stop to another, remember to take notice, slow down and find wonder in the small things. Most importantly, take a moment to learn the valuable lessons our children may teach us.

If we embrace the reality that we are all children of God, regardless of our age, then teaching and learning never ends. To that end, in September, Sunday mornings at Holy Cross will provide us with the opportunity to learn from one another. We will provide time on Sunday mornings for each of us to become better equipped at experiencing and sharing our faith. We hope you consider joining us for an amazing time of becoming better equipped as we discover together what God is up to.

All worship options feature the same sermon message each week.

Following our call to care for our neighbor and to love one another, the Church Council embraces compliance with the updated mask guidance for all K-12 and childcare facilities. Realizing that our facility houses both preschool and childcare and that our congregation is composed of families of all ages, we believe it is prudent at this time to help slow the spread of the Delta variant and to prevent further needless illness and death.

Everyone present within our building for worship, meetings, education, employment or hospitality gatherings needs to be wearing a facial covering regardless of vaccination status. Social distancing expectations will continue throughout the building.

Both the CDC and IDPH have issued the same protocols and recommendations and we have been following their guidance throughout the Covid pandemic. It is our hope that this effort will help to care for those who are immunocompromised, ineligible for vaccination, or at risk from an asymptomatic carrier.

The drive-in worship service is held outdoors and masks are not required. If a mask is your choice we respect that decision. You may remain in your vehicle or bring a lawn chair and enjoy the outdoors. We are utilizing liturgy and hymnody as part of this service. When Holy Communion is offered we will continue with the individual communion kits. Holy Communion is being offered on the first and third Sundays of each month. Offerings may be made in person, through traditional mail delivery, or online at the church's website.

Sunday School In the Sun for Everyone

Starting Sunday, September 26 at 9 am

The concept of Sunday School may stir many different thoughts and reactions. You may recall one particular Sunday School teacher who you enjoyed and connected in a way that your faith was enriched. For others, the memories may not be as positive. The purpose of the Sunday School experience is hopefully about us discovering a deeper relationship with God our creator and Jesus who embodies a message of unconditional love and grace in our lives. How is this supposed to work? It is our hope that this faith formation journey is more than just the conveyance of information about God and Jesus. Our hope is that people of all ages, when given the opportunity, would be willing to engage in sharing their insights and faith moments.

To that end, Holy Cross is embarking on a path of creating space and place for such faith formation moments to be shared by people of all ages. Both children and adults become each other's teachers and students. Together we discover what it means to experience a more intimate and personal relationship with the sacred and holy in our life.

Sunday School in the Sun for Everyone will begin on Sunday, September 26 at 9 am and finish no later than 9:45 am. We'll meet outdoors for September and October under pop-up structures. No need to register in advance. Each week will involve, a Bible moment, music, varied activities (art & games), and time for conversation and sharing. If you attend 8 am in-person worship please plan on staying. If you attend the 10 am drive-in worship please plan on arriving earlier. This 'faith formation' opportunity will work only with the involvement of children (all ages), parents and Holy Cross members (all ages) who are willing to explore and grow in their own understanding of what it means to be a child of God in the 21st century. Our dream is that this will become one of those multigenerational moments that we look back on and realize the blessing that it is for our children and for us all.

Leading in Times Like This

Have you ever noticed all the references in the Gospels to Jesus praying or going off to pray? The number of them suggests that it was a frequent occurrence in Jesus' life and something the Gospel writers thought was essential for us to know. One particular passage was when Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane before his crucifixion. At that moment, Jesus prayed with such intensity and seriousness that he was sweating drops of blood.

I think it is healthy for us to realize that Jesus' prayer practices were not motivated by a need to appear pious, about addressing duties and expectations, but by the reality of his life. The critical takeaway of these accounts is that even for Jesus, and likewise for us, life is hard, exhausting, especially when trying to make a difference.

In Leadership on the Line: Staying Alive Through the Dangers of Leading, Ron Heifetz writes this about Jesus and ourselves:

"We all reach our limits. At times, Jesus may have been overwhelmed, too. He got tired. He retreated. He tried occasionally to set limits on the people he chose to heal. In response to reaching your own limits you have a choice. You could say respectfully to yourself, "You know, I can't take anymore of this today. I can't witness any more today. Time to turn on an old movie, look back at some family pictures, take time off, and reacquaint myself with the sweetness of life, because that sweetness exists all the time, too." Or, you can allow your heart to close: by numbing yourself, developing a thick callus, or losing your innocence altogether."

Last month at the Global Leadership Summit, this same challenge, to not be overcome by the burdens of leading in times like this, was front and center. First, Craig Groeschel coined the word "PUC," pain, uncertainty, and chaos, and how that is causing fatigue, anxiety, and depression as we deal with our reality and trying to lead through it. Later, Rich Wilkerson talked about "the grind" of everyday life and leadership, while Dr. Henry Cloud highlighted the current mental health crisis and being aware of our own needs.

Whether you are leading in your family, in your workplace, as a volunteer, or whatever the context is, I invite you to notice the burden and the price of making a difference. At Holy Cross, I hope that we can all support and inspire each other, engage in prayer and other practices that renew our spirits, and find what we need to keep doing good.

DIFFICULT WORDS of **IESUS**

During this new six session learning opportunity, Holy Cross will examine the most difficult teachings of Jesus with material from Dr. Amy-Jill Levine, a professor at the Vanderbilt Divinity School.

Jesus provided his disciples teachings for how to follow Torah, God's word; he told them parables to help them discern questions of ethics and of human nature; he offered them beatitudes for comfort and encouragement. But sometimes Jesus spoke words that followers then and now have found difficult. He instructs disciples to hate members of their own families (Luke 14:26), to act as if they were slaves (Matthew 20:27), and to sell their belongings and give to the poor (Luke 18:22). He restricts his mission (Matthew 10:6); he speaks of damnation (Matthew 8:12); he calls Jews the devil's children (John 8:44).

In The Difficult Words of Jesus, Amy-Jill Levine shows how these difficult teachings would have sounded to the people who first heard them, how they have been understood over time, and how we might interpret them in the context of the Gospel of love and reconciliation.

There will be three different opportunities to participate in these discussions: During Tuesday nights (Zoom only), the Saturday Morning Men's Group (in-person or online), or the Women's Discussion Group (in-person). See page 6 for meeting dates.

During our discussions, we will refer to Dr. Levine's book, *The* Difficult Words of Jesus. Copies of the book are available to pick up at Holy Cross in the gathering space near the "Inspiration & Curiosities" bookshelf on Sundays between worship services from 8:45 - 9:55 am or contact the church office for alternate pick up arrangements at office@holycrosschurch.org or (847) 367-4060.

But chances are, the decisions that led to your greatest regrets could have been avoided if you had paused to ask yourself, "What story do I want to tell?" From here on out, write a story worth telling. Write a story you're proud to tell. If you're in the middle of making a decision right now, stop and ask yourself: Of the available options, which one do I want as a permanent part of the story of my life?"





Wonder-full

One of the curriculums used in our Early Childhood Ministries here at Holy Cross is something called Godly Play where stories from Scripture are told using simple toys and the leaders wonder with the students about what it was like to be in the story or why it happened the way it did.

Wonder is an important part of faith. We wonder about big questions and learn something from the simple act of asking as well as any answers that we might actually discover. We experience wonder—or awe—in the face of God's grandeur, God's creation, and then we get to witness or be part of something amazing.

As adults who interact with kids, we know that they have hard questions. Questions that are difficult to answer in age-appropriate words... or really, with words at all. We don't have all the answers—but we can wonder and explore with our kids.

Here are some ideas about how to cultivate wonder:

- When you're reading a story—whether it's from Scripture or your child's favorite book—stop and wonder about what a character might be feeling or why a character did what they did
- Take in some of God's amazing creation with your children. See a sunset (or, if you're like my family, perhaps a sunrise), look out over Lake Michigan, notice the details of sunflowers or study the life cycle of a cicada or a butterfly. Get out a magnifying glass, binoculars or a telescope (I believe some libraries have telescopes to check out!). Be sure to thank God for God's amazing creation! Perhaps you can even wonder about how we can participate with God in caring for that creation.
- Don't be afraid to say "I don't know". Model curiosity. Sometimes you can find answers to things you don't know, but some questions may not have easy answers. At those times, rely on things we trust about God. We trust that God loves us. We trust that God forgives us and will abide by God's promises of new life. We trust that God is working in the world.
- I have not done this—so take it with a grain of salt—but I have thought about keeping a note in my phone with a list of questions my kids ask. They often ask the questions as they are supposed to be going to sleep at night. While I sometimes take the time to answer then, I often say we'll talk about it later and then neither of us remembers. Perhaps a prompt to look at questions at breakfast the next morning or when we're driving to our next activity might work.

Finally, as we seek to help kids grow in a life of faith, we may also experience questions and growth. Holy Cross has many opportunities for faith formation—some that will soon be available for us to experience with our kids. Keep an eye out for ways to engage in wonder and awe with the kids in your life!

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation ministry will resume in-person on Sunday, October 3, 6:30 - 8 pm. Confirmation is offered to 6 - 8 grade youth. Confirmation sessions will be comprised of a large group learning moment, worship and music experience and small relational groups for sharing and conversation. There will be activities and snacks as appropriate.

9th Grade Confirmation

The three years of confirmation culminates with the "Affirmation of Baptism" worship service. We will celebrate with our 9th grade confirmands on Reformation Sunday, October 31 at the 10 am worship service. There are two final pieces to this faith journey: evening sessions and a retreat experience.

There will be two Sunday evening sessions of Sunday, September 12 and 19. These two sessions will provide time for dinner conversation and activities that will offer a deeper dive into the next transition in the confirmands' faith journey.

The all day retreat will be held on Saturday, September 25 at Lutherdale Bible Camp near Elkhorn, WI. We will depart from Holy Cross at 8 am and return by 5 pm.
