As the fall season unfolds, a heartwarming tradition has been gracing the halls of our church. Each Wednesday morning, the children attending CrossWays Preschool and Celebration! Childcare embark on a journey to Chapel, an enchanting experience that fills their hearts with joy, laughter, and valuable life lessons.

Deaconess Katie, Edwin, or a dedicated member of our Early Childhood Ministry team, come together to share a Bible story or tales that guide the children in understanding their emotions and the art of Social Emotional Learning. These stories are instrumental in helping the little ones navigate the complex terrain of their feelings and interpersonal relationships.

One individual who has captured the hearts of our students is Mr. Dale, a true celebrity in their eyes. His enchanting songs and the lively motions of the Hippo Song keep the children engaged, active, and enthusiastic. The joy he brings to Chapel is palpable, and it's a time of worship that brings immense life to our community.



Even when I'm not leading Chapel, I try to attend each week, for I recognize the immense joy that permeates the room during this time. It's a joy I wish for everyone to experience.

Occasionally, we receive visitors who are irresistibly drawn to what's happening in Chapel. They describe the atmosphere as magnetic, filled with giggles, laughter, and shouts of pure joy. One council member recently had the pleasure of witnessing this firsthand and shared their experience with the rest of the council.

In another beautiful moment, as our young students were parading back to their classrooms, one of them unexpectedly hugged a ministry partner who was preparing for a Project Healing Waters event. This spontaneous act of love touched their heart so deeply that they couldn't wait to share the heartwarming encounter with others.

These heartwarming moments reflect the essence of a passage from the Gospels. In Matthew, Mark, and Luke, Jesus tells the disciples, "Let the little children come to me and do not stop them. For it is to such as these that the Kingdom belongs." It says he rebuked those who tried to prevent parents from bringing their children to him for a blessing. Was it a rebuke or a strong reaction to the possibility of missing the experience of innocence, purity, and joy that is the essence of the Kingdom?

Sometimes, as I walk down the hallway and catch a glimpse of the Kingdom at work, I feel selfish. It's a privilege to serve in a community of faith that passionately offers ministry to families and young children. At Holy Cross, we are truly blessed to see the Kingdom of God at work through the ministry that has been entrusted to us.

I pray that each of you can experience the Kingdom in this beautiful way, even if you cannot always be present during our ministry activities. We have numerous opportunities to experience the Kingdom within our community. Events like "Fallin' Into Fun" in late September have successfully brought together many families, teachers, staff, and congregants. These gatherings provide a chance to share the Kingdom's love with young families in Lake County, near and far. I invite you to join us in this effort to bring the Kingdom of God into our lives in the coming days.

May the joy and love experienced in Chapel and our various ministries continue to inspire us, and may we, as a community, embrace the Kingdom and make it a reality in our lives.

Special Congregational Meeting to Approve Updated Constitution Sunday, November 5 at 9:30 am by Andy Eidson, Church Council President

As announced at the January 2023 annual meeting, Holy Cross embarked on a process to update our current constitution which dates from year 2000 and bring it into compliance with the current ELCA model constitution for congregations.

A special congregational meeting has been called for Sunday, November 5 at 9:30 am to seek approval of the updated constitution. A majority of those present must vote in favor to approve the document. At the January 2024 annual meeting, we will be seeking "ratification" of the document, which requires at least a two-thirds majority.

In order to afford members the opportunity to review and comment on the document prior to November 5, the proposed updated constitution is now available on the church website at holycrosschurch.org/constitution



The document consists of 20 chapters and 32 pages. Additional information about the content of the document, including the sections that contain required wording from the ELCA, is available there.

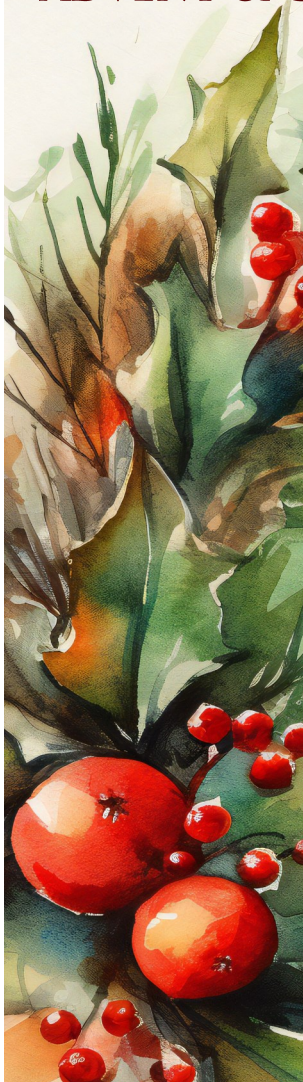

A Year of Holy Days: Thanksgiving

But wait, Thanksgiving is a civil holiday, not a religious one... that's correct. Not to mention it's a holiday rooted more in mythology and modern ideals than it is in factual historical records. I'm not bringing up Thanksgiving to dredge our past with problematic realism (at least not this time, but I'm always happy to talk about it).

I'm bringing it up because I believe every day is holy. Not perfect, but holy. Not good, but holy.

This holiday is not perfect. It's profoundly flawed. Our lives are not perfect. Our society, our neighborhoods, our country are not perfect. That doesn't mean we stick our fingers in our ears and ignore it, it doesn't mean we fight to deny it, it doesn't mean we raze it to the ground; but it does mean that "it is what it is"... problematic, beloved, and otherwise.

For me, there are three things that make Thanksgiving Day holy:

1. Most famously, this day is known for the food. But I don't want to fall into the trap of food as a luxurious status symbol. Instead, I'm reminded of the J.R.R. Tolkien quote, "*If more of us valued food and cheer and song above hoarded gold, it would be a merrier world.*" A day of feasting is not defined by how expensive the grocery bill was or how Instagram-worthy the table spread was, but how it filled the hearts of those there. Remember, living your entire life never fearing hunger is exceedingly rare. Our standard of living is the anomaly. Today is a day to rest in a sense of "enough". For us, the more poignant understanding could very well be pushing ourselves to accept that we, ourselves, are enough. We do not need more.

2. Thanksgiving is holy because of the sacredness of family. Somehow, on this day, we collectively agree to stop working, stop hustling, and be with our loved ones. Maybe it's a day to actually enjoy being together as a small nuclear family instead of everyone running in opposite directions. Or is this the one day of the year for far flung extended family to make the pilgrimage "home"; catching up on all the life that has passed in the last year? Perhaps this is the glorious season of Friendsgiving and chosen family, where joy breaks through isolation and love heals broken hearts. God created us for loving relationships and this celebration of family, in all its forms, is (in my humble opinion) so very sacred.

3. In Christianity, we are a covenantal people. In Bible study you might learn about the covenants God made with Noah, Abraham, Moses, and David. Closer to our own personal faith, we hear Jesus' declaration of a new covenant each time we come to receive holy communion. We are a covenantal people, our faith is sealed and bound by the blood of Christ. Our part of the deal is living in "right relationship" —with ourselves, with each other, with God, and with all of creation. Thanksgiving is when all around us we hear romanticized versions of native American tribes that "lived at one with nature"—the greatest mistake being the assumption that these people are gone and not still here. This day is a poignant setting for our own self reflection, for us to examine our own way of living and how we might hold up our end of the covenant. Have we thought of how our lives affect the rest of God's creation? Who is welcome at our banquet table? This day is sacred as yet another opportunity to become who we claim to be, who we are called to be.

Also, additional items are provided such as school supplies, shoes, clothing, sports equipment and meals, if necessary, so that students may be successful and healthy learners.

 **The Boys and Girls Club of Rosebud** mission is to enable all young people to reach their full potential and explore new opportunities. They provide after-school care, tutoring, meals, field trips, athletics and more.

We also support Dorothy Peterson, our Holy Cross Missionary Liaison, for her continued involvement providing food gift cards and various other items to those living in Rosebud. Dorothy has been a part of Rosebud for over 20 years bringing much needed prayer and loving care for our Lakota friends.

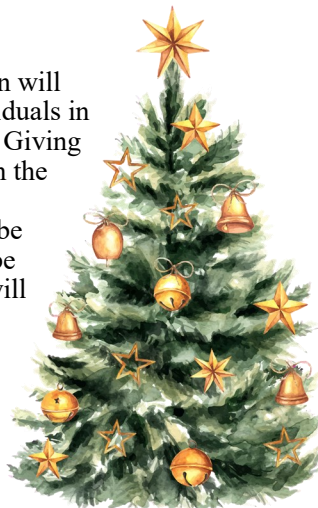

Join the Holy Cross AV Club!

Hello Church! We've got a great team in the AV Club right now, with Corbin Chartier, Ryan Berger, Justin Smith and me managing our live stream as well as the audio and video feed to the fellowship area and the screen projections in the sanctuary, but that doesn't mean we don't need to expand! The fact of the matter is that these volunteers have been extremely faithful in showing up every Sunday and running our technical arts equipment for the 8 and 10 am livestreams, and they need some occasional Sundays off to be with their families, as well as travel. We've developed some reasonably simple systems to make participating in the AV Club a fun and rewarding way to support the worship experience for our online viewers as well as our in-person congregation.

Soundboard:

Though it may seem unintuitive, running the soundboard is actually quite easy. It is set up in such a way that there is only one slider that needs to move up or down so the viewers of the livestream can hear the organ and congregational singing or prayers. This adjustment has no impact on what the congregation in the sanctuary hears, but it's integral to the home viewing experience. There is one "on" button and one "off" button, so it's a very low pressure position.

Screen Projection:

The sanctuary projection is a very easy system to operate, requiring one finger and two ears! All you need to do is listen to what the pastors, readers and musicians are saying and singing, and hit the space bar when it's time to advance to the next slide. There are additional opportunities to adjust the slide text, pick which art asset is projected, and cueing videos for playback in the sanctuary.

Cameras:

Running the cameras for the livestream is a more involved situation, but it is a great place to volunteer with a friend as a team. This workstation not only points the cameras, but also adds overlays with links to the bulletin and the donation page of HolyCrossChurch.org

Having one person pointing cameras and another preparing the onscreen displays is a great way to make this position for a two person team. Having said that, my 12 year old has run the cameras and he was able to pick up the controls very easily and can't wait for the opportunity to do it again.

Directing:

With every team of volunteers, we will have a director. The director makes sure that the screens are switching at a good rhythm for reading along, making suggestions for camera angles and keeping an eye on what is happening next in the church service to make sure that at least one camera is trained in advance. The director also keeps the livestream audio in mind to make sure every viewer, live or online, has the best experience we can provide. Directors need to understand the flow of worship, where focus goes during key moments of the service, and a clear vocabulary to communicate with the entire team. While a director shouldn't ever have to touch any of the equipment, it is definitely the most focus-intensive position.

If any of this sounds interesting to you, please reach out! We will always provide training and supervision so nobody is ever working in alone in the department without ample help and support until they feel comfortable with their station.

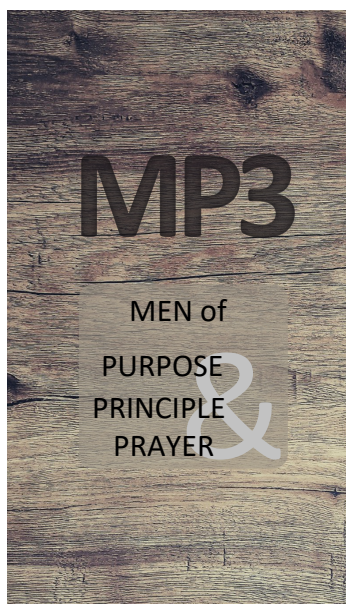

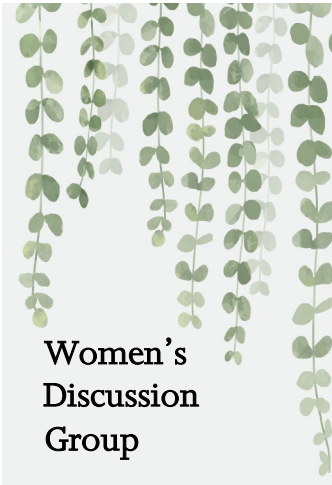

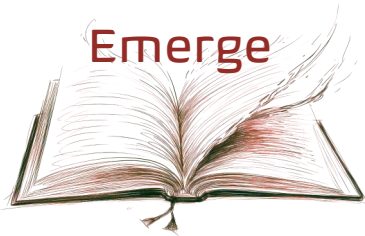

Serving in a New Way

To address homelessness, PADS of Lake County continues to move forward with the new hotel based model. This approach meets the clients where they are. It removes the uncertainty of the lottery system and having a warm place to sleep. It enables PADS to better provide case management, reduces barriers to resources and provides better mental health assistance, with the ultimate goal of making homelessness rare, brief, and non-recurring. This will also be a year-round program as homelessness has no season.

This is an ever-evolving process to determine the recurring needs and how the faith community can support their efforts. I am in weekly contact with PADS central and the former host site coordinators. We are working closely together to address the specific need for food and what that support should look like.

PADS is also looking for a part-time Volunteer Coordinator. If you or anyone you know might be interested here is the information directly from PADS:

Volunteer Coordinator Description

PADS is embarking on a new and exciting journey that will effectively position PADS for greater sustainability. As we work to better cultivate and support our volunteer community, we have available a part-time Volunteer Coordinator position that will rest inside of our Development team but will have direct communication and coordination with our Programs team.

The coordinator will be responsible for interviewing, hiring, and training volunteers and placing them in different roles based on their qualification and interests. They will maintain accurate records of volunteer engagement and serve as a critical and strategic position inside of the agency. They will support operations that involve volunteers and communicate volunteer needs and recommendations to the Leadership team.

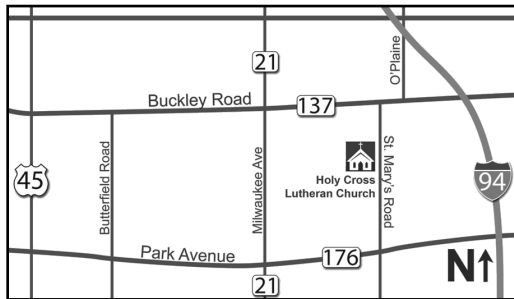
