Invite - "Come and See!"

In the May newsletter, I shared a cycle and pattern for making space to grow and follow Jesus. **INVITE**, **NURTURE**, **EQUIP**, and **SERVE**. In the next few months, I will make use of this space to dive deeper into each of these four themes.

When our daughters were little, we would vacation at a cabin of a friend who generously offered us space and time to get away. Those times were quiet and simple. Vacationing with infants and toddlers is about a change of scenery and perhaps finding a sliver of time to do things done in the BC (before children) era.



I enjoy cycling and remember one week in Door County, I found time early in the morning to get out for a ride on the back roads around Gills Rock and Ellison Bay. I was back before breakfast. It was wonderful and I continued this after that vacation finding routes and riding on the weekends. I pushed myself to discover new routes and ride longer distances.

I got to a point where I wanted to explore and ride farther but it didn't feel safe and felt lonely. A friend at work who was an avid cyclist, shared some routes he rode with his buddies and organized rides he had done. As I listened and asked more, my friend sensed I was looking for a riding partner or group and he invited me on a ride. This led me to experience cycling much more deeply and to be part of a new community in so many ways.

Perhaps there are people who feel similarly when it comes to practicing faith. There must be people interested in knowing Jesus more deeply or wondering what it is to be part of a church. Are there people already part of the church who are looking for ways to grow more deeply in any way? The longing to be invited more deeply into learning who God is and who we are in relationship does not go away.

Humans desire community, relationship, purpose, and growth. We desire community in different and life-giving ways. Humans search for this and hunger after it. If we look in our hearts, we find a desire to connect, belong, and be invited to greater experiences of God's creation. I believe we long to be invited to something larger than ourselves.

We remember Jesus' words, "Follow me," from the stories where he calls the disciples. The Gospel of John uses similar words when Jesus invites Andrew and another who are disciples of John the Baptist. He says, "Come and see," when they ask, "Rabbi, where are you staying?" They desperately want to be fully part of God's people. The synagogues and the Temple are more about protecting the Holiness of God. This results in many having little or no part in the faith community. Andrew and the other were waiting to be invited into something more, something different, something life giving. They had been following John the Baptizer who was doing community differently in the wilderness. John proclaimed what many hadn't heard before but had hoped to hear all their lives, "Here is the Lamb of God." Andrew and the other ask Jesus, "Rabbi, where are you staying?", "Where do you hang out?", "Where can we find you?" Jesus invites them, "Come and see." They found the one they had been waiting for. Imagine the excitement. Jesus invites these two to experience the hopes of their people held for generations! More than that, Jesus invites them to actively take part in the inner workings of the Kingdom!

As I share this with you, invitation is not only getting new people to come and see Holy Cross. The invitation to come and see is for every person; first time guests, those who have attended only a few times, those who attend regularly, new members, long time members, volunteer ministry leaders, church staff, and even me your pastor. "Come and see," invites us to what we already experience but also to experience more deeply what gifts God is calling us towards.

What have you been watching and waiting for as you grow in faith? Do you long to experience your faith, this community, the Kingdom, and the relationship we have with God in greater ways? Have you wanted to sing in the choir? I invite you, come and see. Be a worship leader? Come and see. Lead a small group study? Come and see. Take part in Sunday School as a leader or a student? Come and see. Come to Crossroads? Come and see. Join us for worship in person for the first time? Come and see. Wherever you feel curiosity or desire to grow more deeply in faith, I invite you..., Jesus invites you. "Come and see."

A Mission Bigger Than Ourselves

An excerpt from Enough: Discovering Joy through Simplicity and Generosity by Adam Hamilton

"Barbara Glanz is a motivational speaker who conducts workshops for large companies. One day she was speaking at an event for the employees of a grocery store chain. She talked to them about how they saw their life purpose, suggesting that their work was more than stocking shelves or ringing up customers' food purchases or delivering supplies. She told them that every person they met was an opportunity to bless someone, to live out a higher calling or mission. The employees were inspired by her words, including one nineteen-year-old grocery bagger named Johnny.

Johnny, who has Down syndrome, took her words to heart. He went home and tried to think of ways he could be a blessing to others. Finally, he came up with a plan. Each night he would search the Internet for a positive saying that would encourage people. Then he would print out 300 copies and carefully cut the sayings into individual strips. The next day, he would put one of the sayings in the grocery bag of each of his customers while saying,'I put a saying in your bag. I hope it helps you have a good day. Thanks for coming here.'

A month later, the manager noticed that Johnny's line was much longer than the others. Even when he announced that there was no waiting in lines 2 and 3, no one budged. People wanted Johnny to be their bag boy. He touched them and filled them with hope. Johnny got it. He was pursuing a mission that was bigger than his personal satisfaction.

What about each of us? Are we pursuing a mission that is bigger than our personal satisfaction? Can we articulate this mission and its relationship to our faith? Does the allocation of our time and money reflect that mission?"

It is a reminder for us to take time to know what is happening in our yards, neighborhoods and common (public) spaces. And asks again, when you think about where you encounter nature, what first comes to mind? Does it feel like it is somewhere else, but not "here"?








Men of Purpose, Principle & Prayer is one of our men's ministries at Holy Cross. We meet on select Tuesday evenings for fellowship, food and conversation. The evenings begin with fellowship at 6 pm and conclude by 8:30 pm.

The theme for our next MP3 season will be "sacred moments". In Celtic spirituality there is the concept of 'thin places' where the everyday/ordinary moments intersect with the sacred/holy. We will explore this notion and how it actually presents itself in our life and faith journeys. This will be a six-part series held on July 11, September 19, and November 7 with 2024 dates to be announced.

Our plan is to deconstruct the idea of 'sacred' into six components. When our staff members feel valued and loved, they give their best to their work and can easily support their colleagues. They also can develop a positive relationship with our parents, truly using a team approach with home and school. Communication with parents is encouraged and valued.

PADS Ministry Update

When we talk about PADS at Holy Cross we often refer to and support the adults registered at PADS central with our sack lunches, dinner services and clothing purchases. We have, in the past, delivered a thousand dollars of diapers and pull-ups to support the young children.

I'd like to expound on the numbers of children PADS supports. The numbers might surprise you. Currently, 26% of the people in the shelter are below the age of 18, 7% are under the age of 5. Let's break that down further. In the last 12 months PADS has served 783 people in shelter. 109 were households with children. There were 252 children overall. 80 were under five years old, 118 were between five and 12, and 54 were between 13 and 17.

As we grow the PADS ministry here at Holy Cross, it is my hope to try and include the family aspect of homelessness. Thanks to all of you, what we do now is so generous, but wouldn't it be incredible to start to support these families as well.


