Nurture - "Put It in Your Hearts"

"Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts, sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God" — Colossians 3:14-16

It's instinctive when we encounter new life to help it along. Whether it's a newborn baby, a kitten, a puppy, a rabbit, or a young plant, something moves us to act in a way that will help it grow. New mothers instinctively feed and provide comfort to their newborns. When given a plant or a seed, something urges us to help it reach its potential. Children want to help animals when they feel it needs to be cared for. We want to provide just the right elements to foster growth.



Last month we focused on "INVITE," one of the four pillars of living together in a faith community that I introduced in the May edition of *The Cross Connection*. "INVITE, NURTURE, EQUIP & SERVE." (If you haven't already, you can visit our website to read those in past editions at *HolyCrossChurch.org/newsletters*) When we invite others to know God, we offer them an opportunity to be nurtured by God's love.

The verb "nurture" can mean "to supply with nourishment, to educate, or to further the development of." We understand this regarding children and human development, which may be a simple metaphor for our life of faith. In a community of faith, we are nurtured by God's Word. This happens in many ways. One of those is through the study of the scriptures. Another is by hearing God's Word proclaimed through worship and sermons. We are also nurtured through the promises of Holy Communion. God's Word is nurturing when it causes someone to act on behalf of us (or others) to encourage them through kind words, providing for physical needs, and protecting others from harm, to name a few.

Just as nurturing our physical bodies doesn't end as we enter adulthood, neither does being nurtured in matters of faith. Perhaps you have heard a sermon on confirmation Sunday when a pastor reminds the confirmands (and us), "This is not an ending but a beginning."

When children are baptized, their parents are "entrusted with responsibilities: to live with *them* among God's faithful people, bring *them* to the word of God and the holy supper, teach *them* the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in *their* hands the holy scriptures, and nurture *them* in faith and prayer, so that *your children* may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace."²

As those children affirm their baptism at confirmation, they promise "to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth." We are invited to be nurtured but also to care for others. We practice faith in community, being cared for, and caring for others with God's help and guidance.

God invites us into the project of creation. The reason God creates is to have a relationship with all God has created. Also, intrinsic in God's character is the act of caring for all of it. God calls us to nurture creation as well.

We do this in many ways. First, we nurture and are nurtured by hearing God's Word. The easiest way to do this is to gather for worship, where we hear God's word and share in the Lord's supper. Gathering for study in groups like Men's Discussion, Women's Discussion, MP3, LIFT, Crossroads, Men's Breakfast, and many other small groups are ways to be fed, cared for, educated, and have our faith developed.

As your pastor, I want to help you understand and live as a nurturing congregation. This can happen in many ways. As mentioned, it can happen in Bible studies, small groups, service organizations, groups gathered around social activities, and even groups centered around specific care needs such as grief, addiction, or being a caregiver for another person.

There may be an existing group you hope to connect with. Maybe the group you want to be part of doesn't exist yet. Perhaps you have a group you would like to start. I hope to help you connect and equip you to nurture one another to experience God's loving care. As written in Colossians, we "teach and admonish" or "place in each other's minds" or, as the German language says so beautifully, (an das Herz legen) "put to the heart." When we forget or are unsure, we depend on one another to be reminded of God's care for us.



If you own stocks or mutual funds and want to avoid capital gains taxes:

By donating appreciated assets, you can save on two types of taxes by avoiding capital gains tax *and* often getting a full deduction for the value of your gift. **Note:** When you donate stock, please use the tool on our giving page so we can track your donation and send you the correct receipt, and you can get the tax savings you deserve.

If you're 70.5 or older and want to lower your taxable income:

Donations from your IRA to Holy Cross Church may reduce your taxable income and help meet a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). **Note:** When you make an IRA gift, please use the tool on our giving page so we can track your gift and thank you appropriately.

If you want to make the most of your Donor-Advised Fund (DAF):

With a grant recommendation today, you can give from the money you've already set aside without spending an additional cent! The tool on our giving page integrates with your DAF custodian and takes just a few minutes to use (and helps us track your gift—thank you!).

If you want to make an impact with your cryptocurrency:

Donating appreciated cryptocurrency in support of Holy Cross Lutheran Church can help you avoid capital gains taxes *and* get a significant tax deduction. Please use the cryptocurrency giving tool on our giving page.

Mission Endowment Scholarship Fund Gifts
















Preschool Graduation 2023




