## ***You Can't Get To Easter Sunday Without Having Good Friday***

For Christians, there is nothing like the joy of Easter. It's hard not to be surprised by the feeling of hearing *Jesus Christ is Risen Today*, with all the stops pulled out on the organ, the brass calling, and the choir singing. One can't help but feel light and alive!

Easter joy isn't a feeling like happiness. Happiness comes and goes. We can find happiness and lose it. Joy comes to us. It finds us and is beyond our searching. Resurrection joy finds us and outlasts us. It finds us even in the darkest times, which is vital for us to remember.

In the last 50 years, Palm Sunday has also come to be known as Passion Sunday. Passion Sunday was the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent and the beginning of "Passiontide," a time when the church's focus would turn to the sufferings of Jesus. Palm Sunday was the same as today, falling within Passiontide on the 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent. By combining Passion Sunday and Palm Sunday, Passiontide was shortened. Of course, we don't like to focus on suffering. It is uncomfortable, sad, and miserable. Moving from the Hosannas of Palm Sunday to the Alleluias of Easter morning would be easier. It would be happier if we could skip the betrayal, arrest, denial, trial, sentencing, mocking, torture, death, and burial of Jesus.

Life would be easier if we could avoid all these things. Unfortunately, we experience suffering as part of life. As humans, we cannot avoid suffering entirely. Suffering is part of life. No one lives forever. We all experience and are affected by the loss of life and the grief of losing someone close to us.

Admittedly, being fixated on death is unhealthy. So is ignoring it. Being fixated on Good Friday and the crucifixion is unhealthy, but so is avoiding it. You can't get to Easter without Good Friday. There is no resurrection without the crucifixion and death of Jesus. There is no way around death. There is no way around grief. The only way to resurrection for us is through death.

Jesus is the first, but not the last. In Colossians 1:18, the Apostle Paul writes, "he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead," and in 1 Corinthians 15:20, "Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died." Paul exclaims our hope later in verses 53-55; "For this perishable body must put on imperishability, and this mortal body must put on immortality. When this perishable body puts on imperishability, and this mortal body puts on immortality, then the saying that is written will be fulfilled: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"

Do not resist the suffering and passion of Holy Week. Join us for every worship service you can. Jesus is with us through it all. Having journeyed through the valley of the shadow of death, the joy of the resurrection will astound us in ways we can't imagine!
